Managed Care Organizations (MCOs)

The Utah Office of Inspector General focuses oversight on all aspects of the Utah Medicaid program to include traditional Medicaid, referred to sometimes as Fee-For-Service (FFS) Medicaid, and the managed care system, known as Managed Care Organizations (MCOs).

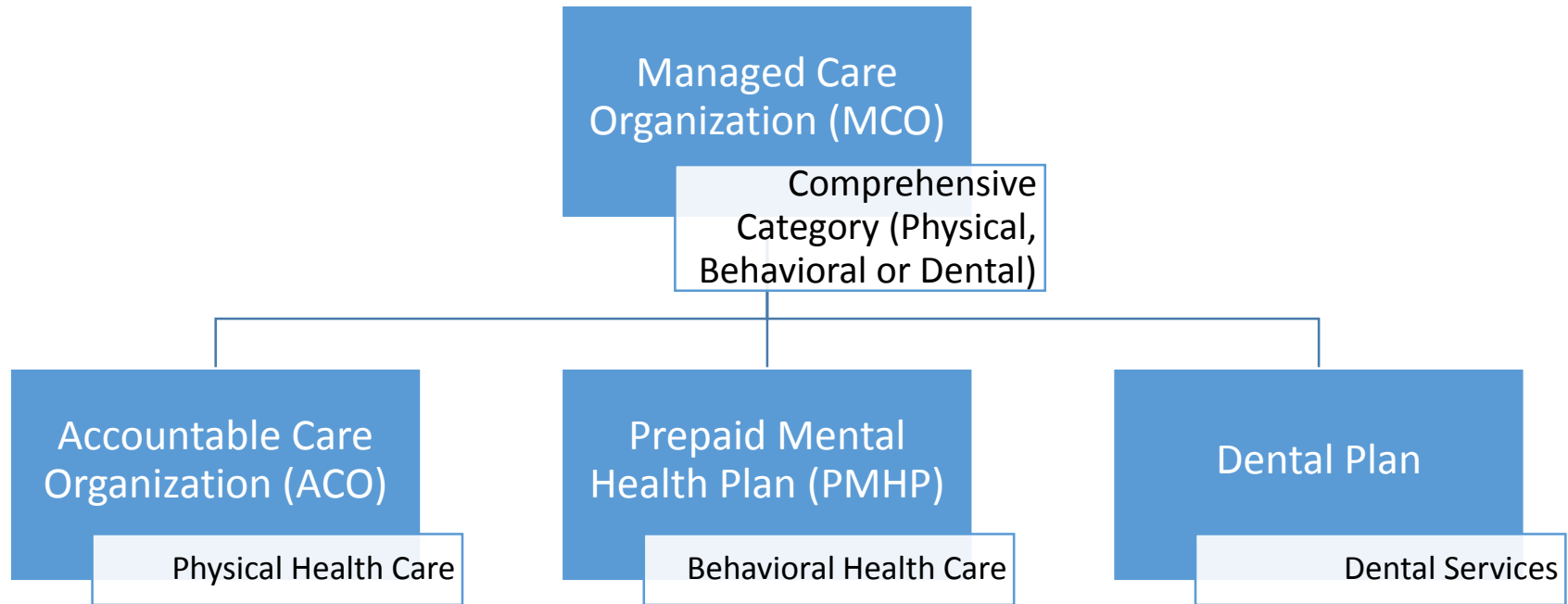
Managed care is a Medicaid delivery system in which the Utah Department of Health contracts with MCOs to provide Medicaid covered services to enrolled members. Utah Medicaid has three types of MCOs:

1. Physical Health Care: An MCO that provides physical health care services is known as an Accountable Care Organization (ACO).
2. Behavioral Health Care: An MCO that provides behavioral health services is known as a Prepaid Mental Health Plan (PMHP).
3. Dental Services: An MCO that provides dental services is called a Dental Plan.
